Outdoor activities range from an affordable family festival on the River Wye to archery sessions, while crafty indoor activities include children's cookery classes and creating fairy or dragon wings. Also, proof that family fun doesn't have to break the bank, there are free craft activities and a weekend camping festival where under 12s are free and the grown-up tickets cost just £12!

Plus, the region has so many accommodation options for those looking to stay longer with plenty of stylish hotels, B&Bs, glamping, camper vans and cottages to rent, still with availability over half term. Prices start from £330 for a family of four for 2 nights glamping on a self-catering basis.

May Half Term Events and Activities

Live on the Wye - Music and Creative Festival Fun - 31 May-1 June

Head to Redbrook, a beautiful village in the Wye Valley for a high-quality community music event set against the stunning backdrop of the Wye Valley and bordering the beautiful Forest of Dean. There's riverside camping and incredible music - from Brazilian afro beats to rootsy folk and reggae with festival circuit bands from Bristol, Wales and London. Little folk are well looked after here with the return of the popular 'Imaginarium' - a dedicated all-weather area and a new quiet area - the Cwtch - for story time and chill out. There's kid's yoga and African drumming workshops as well as a bouncy castle and fancy dress.

Half Term Family Breaks

Slumber under starry skies at Seven Hills Hideaway

This luxury glamping experience is located in Monmouthshire on the edge of the Brecon Beacons. With ensuite bathrooms, fully equipped kitchens, comfortable beds and wood burners, the canvas lodges have all the comforts of home in a field. In a secluded rural location, families can enjoy the peace and quiet of the countryside in acres of space with a tree swing and den building area or from the warmth of the hot tub for those really looking to recharge their batteries! A short drive away is the market town of Abergavenny, where there are plenty of cafes and restaurants, or for those looking to get away from it all, there are miles of walking and cycling trails nearby and the river Wye is perfect for canoeing and kayaking.

Heritage hotel heaven at The Speech House, near Coleford, Gloucestershire

The Speech House Hotel is a former 17th century hunting lodge set in the heart of the Forest of Dean and has 35 rooms, several with impressive antique four-poster beds. For dining there's the informal Orangery, à la carte Verderers or the historic beamed restaurant - the original courthouse for the Forest of Dean.

Built in 1669, the hotel has many original features including fireplaces, paintings and carved oak chairs. Perfectly located bang in the centre of the forest for active families there's cycling, Go Ape and forest walks on your doorstep plus the hotel is dog friendly and serves a pretty good Afternoon Tea, perfect for refuelling after an active day in the forest.

Forest lodges - Forest Holidays, Forest of Dean, Gloucestershire

Set in the Forest of Dean amongst the trees and meadows are 120 cabins, surrounded by a maze of forest walks, trails and meadow. The cabin accommodation includes Silver Birch, Golden Oak, and amazing Golden Oak Treehouses. At the heart of the location is the Forest Retreat, with a shop, café, and bar. Here you can also meet the Forest Ranger, book activities such as night-time wildlife rambles and hire bikes. There is also a children's play area.

Uniquely restored van accommodation in the Wye Valley - Mad Dogs & Vintage Vans

In a small wildflower meadow within the Wye Valley rests 4 vintage vans that have been carefully restored and lovingly converted into bespoke glamping hideaways, each with its own quirks. Gertie is a Cheltenham Gnu sleeping 4 and a very rare lady indeed, believed to be from the 1930s and one of only two in the country. Incredibly well preserved, she still boasts all her original features including handmade oak furniture and gas lamps. There are well-equipped and maintained communal cooking areas and washrooms. Cooking over the open fire is encouraged at the firepit, although each van does have its own BBQ and small stove. Just a short walk down the farm track is the river Wye, where it is often shallow enough to paddle in or skim stones.

Family 'set jetting' camper road trip - Wanderlust Campervans

Wanderlust Camper Co has a fleet of three glamping-style vans - Sally, Lula and Amelia - making a road trip round the Wye Valley and Forest of Dean easy to arrange. Custom designed by the thoughtful owners the vans are comfortable with flexible living accommodation. All have high tops (avoiding the fiddly pop-tops) which means guests can stand up and move around freely in their little home-from-home, a real luxury! The small kitchens are well-equipped, and all campers have heating, and mood lighting.

Follow the region's 'set-jetting' trail checking out the many film and TV filming locations such as Puzzlewood and Symonds Yat which is sure to delight the kids with overnighting at a wide choice of camping spots. Pick up is from the pretty village of Dymock, with easy access from Gloucester or Ledbury train stations.
