The Wye Valley and Forest of Dean region is showing that there is no need to venture into the city to experience the arts with a summer packed full of cultural and music events. Head to where the three counties of Gloucestershire, Monmouthshire and Herefordshire meet for an eclectic mix of open-air events, family fun days and exciting festivals.

Whether listening to an acclaimed Brass Band perform the last night of the proms in a unique stone quarry venue, enjoying the wonders of Harry Potter under the stars, or rocking out to a local band with a cider in hand, there really is something for everyone for the summer ahead.

Open-air Events

<u>Proms in the Quarry</u> – 20 July, Nr Coleford, Gloucestershire

On the 20th July within the depths of the largest quarry of its kind in the Forest of Dean, a special one-off concert is taking place. The 'Last Night of the Proms' will be performed by Lydbrook Band inside the natural amphitheatre of Barn Hill Quarry. Head to the 10-hectare site for a summer's evening of classic Proms favourites and new showstoppers. Open Air Opera at Dean Heritage Centre - 04 August, Soudley, Gloucestershire

The centre which preserves local history is a fitting venue for the opera which was first performed 140 years ago. Summer Festivals

Coleford Music Festival – 13-14 July, Coleford, Gloucestershire

This annual outdoor festival takes over the historic market town of Coleford. On Saturday 13 and Sunday 14 July, festival goers can enjoy a selection of emerging local artists and national headliners, children's entertainment and street food. The Green Gathering is a festival with a difference: the sets are powered by wind and solar energy, the food is strictly vegan and there is a strong emphasis on inspiring festival goers to reduce their environmental impact, an issue which is becoming increasingly relevant. On the outskirts of Chepstow from 1-4 August, the festival will be a place to relax, listen to live music and also learn about alternative technologies and sustainable living.
